A very warm welcome to all who worship with us today.

We are pleased to have you as part of the family of our worshipping community today. All the words you need today are in this order of service. *Words of Guidance are in italics*; the words the Priest says are in normal text; **the words you say are in Bold.**

For Those with Hearing Difficulties

If you are wearing a hearing aid you will find that you hear the service better if you turn your hearing aid to the “T” position.

Gift Aid

If you are a UK tax payer please use the envelope provided, and please fill in your details on it. (If you're not a UK tax payer there is no need to use an envelope.)

I sign you with the Cross

You may or may not find it useful to make the sign of the cross during the service. Doing this is one way of professing the deepest mysteries of the Christian Faith: the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit--and the saving work of Christ on the Cross on Good Friday. The combination of the words and the action are a creed—a statement of belief. If you would like to do this, to help you know where to do so, a ✠ is marked in the Order of Service at possible places.

- Remember the Last Supper, the meal Jesus took with his disciples before his death*
- Give thanks to God the Father for his love for us, and ask Him to intercede in the world for us.*

The prayer continues until...

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:
(sing) Jesus Christ our Lord has died:
Jesus Christ our Lord is risen:
Jesus Christ will come again:
Alleluia! Come, Lord Come!

At the conclusion of the prayer, all acclaim. Amen

Joining our voices with all the whole company of heaven, as our saviour taught us, so we pray

The president breaks the consecrated bread as we sing

**O Lamb of god, come cleanse our hearts
and take our sins away.**

our guilty souls release.

Giving of Communion

The president says the following invitation to communion

God's holy gifts

There are two stations in the church (one at the back and one at the front), and one at the front of the hall—please allow time for the elements to be brought down. If you do not wish to receive communion, but would like a blessing please come forward with everyone else and hold this service booklet in your hands as an indication of this wish. If you do not want to do either of these then please feel free to stay in your seat.

The president and people receive communion.

Authorised words of distribution are used and the communicant replies
